

I was taught that poetry should not be read. Instead, it should be read out loud. Hearing the words brings so much more color and texture to them, making them more alive. Plus, depending on your mood, the whole meaning of the poem can change.

This Lent we are looking at the seven last things Jesus said from the cross. His fourth statement is found in Matthew and Mark - and in Psalms. Read this part out loud - because the Psalms are poems (songs).

Psalm 22
${ }^{1}$ My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
${ }^{2} O$ my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest.
So often we have looked at this Psalm - and those words of Jesus - as a statement of his humanity, that he was struggling with his lot. But then read this part of the Psalm Again, out loud.
${ }^{22}$ I will tell of your name to my brothers and sisters; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:
${ }^{23}$ You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!
${ }^{24}$ For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; he did not hide his face from me but heard when I cried to him.
${ }^{25}$ From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him.
${ }^{26}$ The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord. May your hearts live forever!
Now, get out your Bible (or, if you don't have one, ask us - we'll get you one!), find Psalm 22, and read the whole thing. Out loud. Maybe read it a couple of times. And then realize that even from the cross, Jesus is saying, "I will praise you." (v. 22) The people surrounding him at the cross understood and believed him. We can, too.
